

**Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA) Certification Form**

Any Local Education Agency seeking Ed Tech funds must certify to its State Education Agency that schools have adopted and are enforcing Internet safety policies. It is the intent of the legislation that any school (or district) using federal money (ESEA or E-rate) to pay for computers that access the Internet or to pay for Internet access directly should be in compliance with CIPA and should certify that compliance EITHER through E-rate or the Ed Tech Program. Please check one of the following.

- Our local school district is certified compliant, through the E-rate program, with the Children's Internet Protection Act requirements.
- Every school in our local school district benefiting from Ed Tech funds has complied with the CIPA requirements in subpart 4 of Part D of Title II of the ESEA.
- The CIPA requirements in the ESEA do not apply because no funds made available under the program are being used to purchase computers to access the Internet, or to pay for direct costs associated with accessing the Internet.
- Not all schools have yet complied with the requirements in subpart 4 of Part D of Title II of the ESEA. However, our local school district has received a one-year waiver from the United States Secretary of Education under section 24441 (b)(2)(C) of the ESEA for those applicable schools not yet in compliance.
