2006-07 RESERVATIONS (SET ASIDES) FOR SCHOOLS AND DISTRICTS RECEIVING FUNDS FROM TITLE I, PART A OF NCLB

Parent Involvement ESEA 1118(a)(3): Each school district will reserve not less than **1 percent** of its allocation (if more than \$500,000) for parental involvement. Ninety-five percent of this set aside must be directed to schools receiving Title I funds.

Neglected or Delinquent Children: Only required if the district's allocation notice specifies a neglected or delinquent funding amount.

Homeless Children: To serve homeless children who do not attend Title I served schools.

Incentives for Teachers: No more than 5% to provide incentives and rewards to teachers to work in Title I schools that are in improvement, corrective action, or restructuring (optional).

2006-2007 RESERVATIONS (SET ASIDES) FOR SCHOOLS AND DISTRICTS IDENTIFIED FOR IMPROVEMENT, CORRECTIVE ACTION, OR RESTRUCTURING AND DISTRICTS AND SCHOOLS THAT DID NOT MAKE AYP IN 2004.¹

Professional Development ESEA 1116(b)(3)(A)(iii):

Districts that are identified for improvement must reserve not less than **10 percent** of the district's Title I, Part A funds. The purpose of these funds is to provide teachers and principals high-quality professional development in the area(s) of low performance. This district reservation should be entered on Form 2.

Schools that are identified for improvement must reserve not less than **10 percent** of their school's Title I allocation. The purpose of these funds is to provide teachers and principals high-quality professional development in the area(s) of low performance in the school. This school reservation is not a district reservation, so it is not shown on Form 2. Instead, the appropriate amount of funds must be spent for this purpose out of the school's Title I allocation as shown on Form 1.

Note: If the district and any of the schools have an improvement status, then any school professional development reservations can count toward the district 10% reservation.

Funds for choice-related transportation and supplemental services ESEA 1116(b)(10):

Each school district shall reserve an amount equal ² to **20 percent** of its allocation from which it shall spend an:

- amount equal to **5 percent** for choice-related transportation;
- amount equal to **5 percent** to provide supplemental education services; and
- amount equal to the remaining **10 percent** for choice-related transportation, supplemental education services, or both, as the district determines.

¹ Following 2006 AYP determinations in Fall 2006, districts should amend their budgets to address required reservations or to redirect previously reserved funds, based on 2006 accountability status.

² "An amount equal to" means that the funds required to pay the costs of choice-related transportation and supplemental educational services need not come from Title I allocations, but may be provided from other federal, state, local, and private sources.
