

**FY2010 METCO GRANT PROGRAM
GRANT ALLOTMENT SUMMARY FOR APPLICANTS**

Transportation Services - All districts are entitled to a base transportation allotment, as shown in the accompanying chart. This amount must be used to complete Part II, line 8 of the Projected Expenditure budget detail of the Metco grant application.

Instructional and Support Services – Districts will receive a base per pupil instruction allotment of \$3,350. Enrollment is based on October 1, 2008, SIMS enrollment reporting. Districts do not need to submit a detailed line item budget for these funds. The allotment for each district is shown in the accompanying chart and must be used to complete Part II, line 2, of the Projected Expenditure budget detail of the Metco grant application. Districts must continue to maintain appropriate documentation and adhere to comprehensive accounting of the expenditure of these funds and their relationship to the goals of the Metco program.

If your program has staff members who serve as both program aides and bus monitors, please allocate their costs between lines 2 and 8.
